What will I do?

We invite you to come and spend the week of May 13-19, 2012 working in Appalachia to repair homes and buildings, get to know local residents and learn about one of the poorest regions in the United States.

Join with other college and university students and chaplains putting what you believe into practice. You may be repairing a roof, adding siding or replacing windows. Perhaps you will be digging a foundation for a new addition to a house or trailer or replacing a ceiling or a floor that has fallen through due to a leaking roof or water pipe. Have you ever helped to put on a shingle roof? No problem, we'll give you the experience as we finish replacing the roof on the building where you stay at St. Timothy's.

What will our week be like?

Most will arrive on Sunday evening and we begin first thing Monday morning. Our specific work site will depend upon weather, the number of volunteers and what the most pressing need is at the time. We generally leave around eight-thirty in the morning and arrive back around four or five in the afternoon. Some days, if our work site is close enough

we can return to St. Timothy's for lunch. Monday evening we have an orientation about Appalachian culture and history. Tuesday evening youth and adults from the community

come together for a cookout and chance to meet each other. Wednesday afternoons we take off to visit local attractions.

What will it cost?

The cost for the week is \$100. This will cover lodging and building materials and all meals from Monday breakfast through breakfast Saturday, except Wednesday evening. Additional donations for building materials are welcome.

Your time spent will be helping others, and yet at the same time you will gain far more than you can imagine. Not only will you be able to meet fellow students from around the country, you will have a chance to experience what it is to be a Christian community and change people's lives. In doing so, you too may be changed.
